Belmopan City

Belmopan is the Capital City of Belize. It is located in the Cayo District at an altitude of 76 meters (249 feet) above sea level. The city was constructed just to the east of the Belize River, approximately 80 kilometers (50 miles) inland from the former capital, Belize City. The decision to build Belmopan came after Hurricane Hattie devastated Belize City in 1961, prompting the need for a new capital on safer terrain. Since its establishment, Belmopan has become one of the newest national capital cities in the world. Independence Plaza marks the center of Belmopan with the administrative buildings and the prime minister's office. Banks, post office, BTL (Belize Telecommunications Ltd) and the immigration office are nearby, the Western Regional Hospital, embassies and the main campus for the University of Belize are all within walking distance.

The City of Belmopan a Brief History



- 1. **Hurricane Hattie:** In 1961, Hurricane Hattie struck Belize City, causing extensive damage. Approximately 75% of the buildings in Belize City were destroyed. The vulnerability of Belize City due to its low-lying coastal location prompted the need for a new capital on safer terrain.
- 2. The Movement for a New Capital: In the aftermath of Hurricane Hattie, a movement emerged to establish a new capital farther inland. Belize's Premier George Price led a delegation to London to present the plan for a new capital and petition for funds. Secretary of State for the Commonwealth and Colonies Anthony Greenwood visited Belize, and a monument dedicated to the new capital was created in 1965.
- 3. **Choosing the Site**: The site chosen for Belmopan is about 51 miles west of Belize City. The name "Belmopan" combines two rivers: the Belize River (the country's longest river) and the Mopan River. Construction began in 1967, and the first phase was completed in 1970. The Belize's government offices moved to Belmopan at that time.
- 4. **Growth and Development**: Belmopan has continued to grow since its establishment. It's location nowadays is in the Cayo District at an altitude of 76 meters (249 feet) above



sea level. Notably, the National Assembly Building was designed to resemble a Maya temple.

Geography and History of Belize

Belize, located on the northeast coast of Central America, is bordered by Mexico to the north, the Caribbean Sea to the east, and Guatemala to the west and south. It has a total of 542 km of land borders, with Mexico to the north-northwest (272 km) and Guatemala to the south-southwest (266 km)2. The country's coastline stretches for 386 km along the Caribbean Sea. The name "Belize" is believed to have originated in the Maya Language. According to historical accounts, it was derived from the Maya word "Balix," which means " muddy waters," referring to Belize River. Another theory suggests that the Spanish versions of Indigenous names influenced the name, with "Balis" or "Balize" being used to denote navigational points along the coast.

Is the only English-speaking country in Central America, and by virtue of its geographical location and historical background, is a part of both Central America and the Caribbean. The country therefore participates in the activities of the Central American Integration System (SICA) as well as the Caribbean Community (CARICOM)



The country of Belize consists of six major administrative areas or districts: Corozal in the north, Orange Walk in the north-west, Belize in the east, Cayo in the west, Stann Creek in the south-east and Toledo in the south. The capital of the country, the City of Belmopan, lies in the Cayo District.

The first people to develop Belize were the Maya around 1500 B.C.E. As shown in archaeological records, they established a number of settlements here. These include Caracol, Lamanai and Lubaantun. The first European contact with Belize occurred in 1502 when Christopher Columbus reached the area's coast. In 1638, the first European settlement was established by England and for 150 years, more English settlements were set up in 1840, Belize became a "Colony of British Honduras" and in 1862, it after that became a crown colony in 1973, the region's name was changed from British Honduras to Belize on 21st of September 1981. when full independence achieved.

National Symbols

1. The flag of Belize:

The flag of Belize was adopted on 21 September 1981, the day Belize became independent. It features a royal blue field with two red narrow horizontal stripes along the top and bottom edges. At the center, there is a large white disk bearing the National Coat of Arms. The coat of arms represents the logging industry, which played a crucial role in British settlement. It includes figures, tools, and mahogany trees. The national motto, "Sub Umbra Floreo" (meaning



"Under the Shade I Flourish"), appears below the coat of arms.



1. National flower:

The **Black Orchid** (*Encyclia cochleatum*) holds a special place in the hearts of the people of Belize as their national flower. Symbolizing Belize's natural beauty and resilient spirit, the Black Orchid was designed as the national flower when Belize gained independence the 21st of September 1981.



2. National Tree:

The national tree of Belize is the mahogany tree (Swietenia macrophylla). These majestic trees, often soaring more than 100 feet into the sky, played a pivotal role in Belize's history Their straight trunks and rich grain interiors attracted a motley crew of English seamen and former pirates, who settled in the country and became known as Baymen. Mahogany trees propagate by growing small pear-shaped fruits (inedible for humans) once a year.



3. National Bird:

The keel-billed toucan (Ramphastos sulfuratus) became Belize's national bird due to its striking appearance and its prevalence in the country. Beyond its vibrant plumage, the toucan symbolizes Belize's rich biodiversity and serves as a living emblem of the nation's commitment to conservation and environmental stewardship.



4. The National Animal:

The Baird's Tapir (locally known as the "Mountain Cow," Tapirello bairdii) is the largest indigenous land animal in Belize. The Tapir has a rich history in Belizean culture. The ancient Mayas revered it as a symbol of fertility, often depicting it in their art and mythology.

Belize is the only officially English language-speaking country in Central America. While English is the official language of Belize, Kriol is the language that Belizeans use to speak in their daily life.

Belize is a culturally diverse country, and its population reflects this rich heritage. The major ethnic groups in Belize are:

Mestizo: comprising about the 51.7% of the population, Mestizos have mixed Maya and Spanish ancestry. They are found throughout the country and primarily speak Spanish, but many are also fluent in Belize Kriol and English.

Creoles (Kriols): Creoles account for approximately 25.2% of the population. They are descendants of African slaves brought to Belize to support the logging industry. Over time, they intermarried with Jamaicans, Miskitos, and East Indians.

Maya: The Maya people have lived in Belize since the 2nd millennium BC. Today, they make up about 9.8% of the population. The current Maya population consists of three language groups: Mopan Maya, Q'eqchi' Maya, and Yucatec Maya. They mainly speak Spanish along with Kriol and English.

Garinagu (Garifuna): The Garinagu account for around 4% of Belize's population. They are descendants of Island Caribs and Africans.

Other Ethnic Groups: These include the Mennonites (about 5.6 % of the population), who are of German descent. Additionally, there are smaller groups of Chinese, Taiwanese, East Indians, and other expatriates from the US, UK, and Canada. A blending of cultures has resulted in



one of the happiest and most peaceful countries in the region and a widespread reputation as one of the world's friendliest tourist destinations.

Seasons in Belize Weather and Climate

In Belize, the climate is tropical, with a hot and rainy season from June to October, and cooler season from November to February. Is important to know that from March to May, before the rainy season, the heat gradually increases. Even in winter (November-March) the temperature in Belize rarely falls below 60°F (16°C), while the summer (May-September) temperatures go around 86°F (30°C). Belize also has a hurricane season; it goes from June to October. On average, Belize is hit by hurricanes about twice a year. The last hurricane happened in November 2022 when Hurricane Lisa forced Belize City residents to take shelter due to heavy winds and flooding. Change of seasons here has no effect on time . Belize has no Daylight-saving time. The time is set at GT-6(Central Time) year- round.

















Belize Currency and Money Exchange

The official currency of Belize is the Belize Dollar (BZD; symbol BZ\$). The exchange rate is hard pegged to the US dollar at a fixed rate of BZ\$2 to US\$1. Users can exchange currency at most banks and hotels. ATMs in Belize usually accept foreign cards. Additionally, many

USD businesses accept currency. MasterCard, Visa, and AMEX are widely accepted. However, the Mexican peso is not commonly accepted. ATMs are also available across the country, particularly in tourist destinationsincluding most Placencia. Punta Gorda. Belmopan, Dangriga, Belize City, San Pedro Ambergris Cave, Cave Caulker, Orange Walk, San Ignacio and Corozal. Is important to know Belize Law allows travelers entering the country to bring with them a maximum of U.S. \$5,000. be it in cash, checks or negotiable instruments. This limit is per adult individual.

Mobile Connectivity and Wi – Fi

Though Belize's telecom system is improving, it still does not cover every part of the country. Therefore, Skype, WhatsApp and FaceTime video calls remain effective means of staying connected with friends and family – they provide affordable ways of connecting. Wi-Fi hotspots can also be found at many hotels and restaurants, which is an uncomplicated way to avoid data charges while staying connected.

DigiCell Belize's prominent is most telecommunications company, operating a national GSM cellular network that makes use of smartphones compatible with this DigiCell provides technology. bundles and monthly subscription plans suitable for cell phones, laptops and tablets that include unlimited text messaging/data usage as well as voice call minutes - these plans can be found at most electronic stores/gas stations/convenience shops across Belize.

Market and Food Stalls





Belmopan Market Plaza: Belmopan's premier open-air Farmers Market located in Bliss Parade Ave. near the Civic Center, is supporting small food, clothing, and artisanal vendors. Market day is every Tuesday and Friday (unless it is a national holiday). Vendors and farmers from Belmopan and nearby villages begin to gather from about 4 a.m. and all-day long buyers can get great deals on fruits, vegetables, dairy products, meats, local treats, clothing, shoes, accessories and much more!

Belmopan Market Square: Belmopan's Market Square is located near the bus terminal corner Constitution Drive and Bliss Parade. It is a principal place where vendors set up small stalls to sell their products. Anything can be found here including fruits, vegetables, clothes, shoes and electronics.

In both markets you can find food prepared on the spot, some dishes that can be tasted are tamales, tacos, burritos, panades, pupusas, Fry- Jacks, scrambled eggs, at lunchtime you can taste local dishes such as rice and beans, Stew chicken, rice and cow- food soup and much more at very affordable prices.

Belmopan Market Night:



The Belmopan City Counsil is the institution in charge of organizing the dates on which the Belmopan Night Market is open, it is a family friendly event where local entrepreneurs offer their products, including traditional Belizean dishes such as rice and beans, barbecue, tacos, different drinks, clothing, home accessories, and activities for children. 














Accommodations, Health and Transportation

Hotels and Accommodations

The hotel offered in Belmopan is designed to provide spaces for rest and recreation for its quests. Some offer special packages such as horseback riding, golf courses, access to rivers or swimming pools. The rates vary depending on the location, the season of the year, and the different amenities and services provided; In Belize there is a high season (December-May) and a low season (June- October) for tourists, which must be considered into the budget. Additionally, some hotels offer organization or transportation to the airport. Table one shows the list of hotels and their contact information located in Belmopan.

Health providers and Pharmacies in Belmopan

Belmopan has health services in different specialties; From family doctors to hospitals with specialists in different medicine sectors, hospitals are equipped with clinical laboratory, pharmacies, and emergency area. Public sector services are intended for residents at more affordable prices and private healthcare centers, depending on the specialty, their cost per consultation may vary. It is advisable to call the health provider and schedule an appointment. Prior to avoiding long waits, also is important to mention about the Doctors in the specialty of odontology most of them has their private clinic and an appointment is strongly necessary for consultation and follow treatments. Due to the high demand services. Laboratories dental are equipped to do routine tests, specialized tests can be sent to another country if is necessary to get the most accurate results, but generally regular test results may be available in less than 24 hours. Some Private laboratories can send the test results as soon as they are available via email as well. The list of the main health centers and pharmacies of Belmopan can be found in Table 2.

Diplomatic Missions, Embassies and Consulates

The list of diplomatic missions in Belize is made up of 39 foreign embassies and consulates from 37 countries around the world, which are mainly located in Belize City, Belmopan and Orange Walk Town for reference of further information is presented in table 3. Also Is advisable visit the website of the embassy or consulates to get to know about the services that are available or get in contact via phone call for any questions prior your visit.

Public and Bank Holidays

Belize celebrates their national holidays each year, with the Easter holiday spanning a four-day celebration. Some of these holidays are religious-based and their dates vary annually based on the lunar cycle. Here is a breakdown of some key holidays in Belize:

New Year's Day (January 1)

George Price Day (January 15) – Commemorates Belize's first Prime Minister, George Cadle Price.

National Heroes & Benefactors
Day (March 9) – Originally "Baron Bliss
Day," honoring a wealthy Englishman who
left his fortune to Belize.

Good Friday, **Holy Saturday**, and **Easter Monday** – Moveable holidays based on the church calendar.

Labour Day (May 1) – Also known as International Workers' Day.



Emancipation Day (August 1) – Marks the abolition of slavery.

Commonwealth Day (May 24) – Formerly Sovereign's Day, honoring the monarch's birthday.

Saint George's Caye Day (September 10) – Commemorates a key battle against the Spanish Empire in 1798.

Independence Day (September 21) – Celebrates Belize's independence from Great Britain in 1981.

Pan America Day (October 12) – Formerly Columbus Day.

Garifuna Settlement Day (November 19) – Honors the Garifuna people, with African and Carib roots.

Christmas Day (December 25) and Boxing Day (December 26) – The latter is a day for charitable works or leisure activities.

These holidays are governed by the Holiday Acts in Belize, which specify rules for observance, including replacement days if a holiday falls on a weekend. So, Belizeans get to enjoy these special days throughout the year see a resume of the public and bank holidays for the year 2024 at the table 4.

Public and Private Transportation

Belize City and the Philip S.W. Goldson International Airport (PGIA) are hubs for most rental agencies, with localized services available in the larger tourism destinations. Boats, known locally as water taxis, are the primary means of transportation between the islands and the mainland and, of course, to barrier reef attractions. Regularly scheduled water taxis operate between Belize City, Caye Caulker and San Pedro.

Driving in Belize, visitors can rent a car at the Belize International Airport. Car rental companies can be found right in the parking lot of the airport. Use online maps to reach distinct locations; visitors must be careful with the speed bumps that are used instead of stoplights in many areas.

There are three paved highways running through Belize they are the Phillip Goldson Highway, which runs between the Mexican border and Belize City: the George Price Highway, running between. Belize City to the border of Guatemala; and the Hummingbird Highway which leads to southern Belize.

Buses: Belize City Council operates the bus system, these colorful buses traverse major highways on the mainland, connecting towns and destinations.

Taxis: Independently operated taxis are available for local travel.

Water Taxis: If you are heading to nearby islands like Ambergris Caye or Caye Caulker, water taxis are a popular choice.

Busitos: (Belmopan) those are independent minivans that travel from the market square parking lot, to surrounding neighborhoods including the University of Belize. The fee is \$2.00 BZD per person; they depart every 15 minutes from the parking lot.

Main Bus Companies:

Westline Bus Co. Ltd, Shaw Bus Service, Belize Bus Owner's Cooperatives (B.B.O.C.) and **Floralia** bus **company** operate buses on the Western Zone highways. For better reference, go to figure 1 there is an example of the bus schedule of the Westline Bus company on the route of Belize City, Belmopan, and Bengue Viejo del Carmen. There are two payment methos first buy the bus ticket before getting into the bus or pay later whit a designed person during the trip only cash Belize dollar and USD dollars are accepted. Buses can be overcrowded in the morning around 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., especially on Mondays and Fridays. There are two types of services as well; express, that is a non-stop bus, and the regular bus that makes stops during the road



as the person reaches their personal destination on the bus route. To see the details of the schedule of all bus routes consult:

JETS Shuttle Belize: Offers reliable border-to-border transportation services.

Belize Airport Shuttle Service (BASS): Provides shuttle service to various destinations in Belize.

Philip S.W. Goldson International Airport (BZE): Located near Ladyville (about 10 miles north of Belize City), BZE is the primary gateway for international flights to Belize.

Airlines serving BZE include Alaska Airlines, American

Airlines, Delta, JetBlue, Southwest, Tropi c Air, United, WestJet, Air Canada, Tag Guatemala and Copa.

Book your airport shuttle in advance for convenience and cost-effectiveness If you need to reach Belize City for a water taxi to the islands, consider ground transportation options. Belize's airport is small and

manageable, so navigating it should be a breeze.

If you need assistance during your stay in Belize, you can leview the Belize University contact list that appears in the Table 6 they will be able to help with information or assistance with lindress and promutness.

In Belmopan, emergency services are available, including ambulance services. If you need an ambulance, you can dial 911. The response time can vary, but the services are reliable and efficient.

Additionally, there is a private ambulance service called Belmopan Service (BES), which operates 24/7 out of Belmopan since 2010. You can reach them at 19 Cardinal Avenue or call +501 802-0355 For other non-emergency the U.S. services. Embassy Belize provides assistance related arrests, deaths, serious illness, or being a victim of crimes. You can contact them at +501-822-40113. Other additional services are the Police and Fire Department for reference see Table 8 where the services available to the City of Belmopan are detailed.
